Ruth: The Plan behind the Pain The Legacy of The Redeemer

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Ruth 4v13-22
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On Sunday, we reached the conclusion of our series in the book of Ruth. The waiting is over...Boaz & Ruth get married!! Not only did we **recognise the redeemer** in Boaz for Ruth but also in Obed for Naomi, who was Ruth's mother-in-law, his grandmother. The promised son of 4:11-12 to Boaz is a gift from God to continue the lineage of grace, through the line of Judah to King David and ultimately...**through Jesus, the greatest redeemer for all!** Through Jesus, we too have a redeemer and in Him, we can **live the legacy of The Redeemer!**

Questions to support Discussion and Application:

1. Ruth would not let pride or fear stop her from **recognising her redeemer** in Boaz. Are there elements in your life that can hinder you from **recognising your redeemer, Jesus?**
2. It took the community around Naomi to help her **recognise her redeemer**. What ways can we as a cell group support one another better in our Christian life? Take some time to conduct a mini cell appraisal to evaluate how well you are doing at building a community that is part of **a BIG community of radical disciples that impacts Canterbury and beyond for Jesus!**
3. As Christians, now that we are part of **the legacy of The Redeemer**, it is our duty and our joy to **live the legacy!** We must declare the good news (Rom. 10:11-14 & Tit. 2:11-15). Get into pairs. In your pairs, one person flick to a verse in the bible, at random, and attempt to weave the gospel message – that is, **the legacy of The Redeemer** – through this verse, preaching it to your partner! Take one minute to do that, and then swap round! N.B. If you really wanna spice things up a bit, why not choose a verse(s) for your partner??
